### Wings of Freedom Tour By Delbert Davis

On Thursday July 31, while some members were on the road to Oshkosh Airventure, others participated in the Collings Foundation's Wings of Freedom Tour at Monroe County Airport. MCRCC members set up a static display of RC aircraft



and provided some great flight demonstrations. The crowd stood in awe each time Bob Watson, Bill Black, Randy Byers, Charlie Thompson and non-club member Mike Habig took to the skies! Other club participants were Al Eygabroad, Dennis Friesel, Delbert

Davis and Damon Ferguson. Later in the day Don Williams, Carl Ward and Tim Mellott joined

the group as spectators.

Collings Foundation pilots had flown a B17, a B24 and their P51C "Betty Jane" fighter to the event on Wednesday. Their B25 aircraft was supposed to be here too, but was down for some unscheduled maintenance in Minnesota.

Several club members took ground tours of the B17 and B24. It was quite exciting to watch the airplanes arrive, then take off





and land during paid passenger flights at the end of each day. We also had some interesting and informative conversations with the aircraft pilots as well as with some former WWII pilots that attended the event.

# Interesting Bits...

On Friday, Dennis Friesel experienced some real-life flight training in the P51C. Here's his eyewitness account: "After getting strapped in (seven buckles including chute and harness),

we took off and did a low, fast fly-by down the runway. At altitude the pilot trimmed the plane and turned the controls over to me. I asked him to talk me through some rolls and a split-s or two. They are just about as easy to do in the real machine as the RC version,



albeit from a far different perspective. I would say I had my hands on the controls for about one-half hour. He did loops and 4-point rolls during the flight and for the coup de grace he did a final 400 mph pass down the runway before landing. That pass was the best part of the flight. It really felt like we were doing a strafeing run, and it sure looked close to the trees to me!"

Cook Aviation President & General Manager Rex Hinkle said the MCRCC static display and flight demonstrations were a very big hit at the event and that he really appreciated our participation. In turn, we expressed gratitude to Mr. Hinkle for allowing us to be a significant part of the event.

## **Blue Moon Racing Report**

I believe our recent race results are worth mentioning. Michael Friesel ended up with the championship points lead (or a tie - I am not sure). He was flying some great rounds, nice and smooth. He did have an issue with his plane in the Gold round and flamed out with some AC damage on landing. Dennis Friesel flew in the Gold round due to Mike's airplane problems and flew some of the best times he has ever turned. He is slowly learning that smooth is fast. I also think he isn't so down on his airplane's apparent lack of speed now that he knows he can beat the other guys by staying smooth and consistent for all six laps. I managed a 2nd place finish in the Gold race and I think I am second in championship points with my Unlimited. It was a very challenging weekend but I demonstrated in the first two races that I was the guy to beat, setting fast time for the weekend. Post-landing inspection after round two revealed I had twisted my crankshaft. My engine was toast but another competitor offered me a smaller replacement engine so I could make the rest of the races. With the use of his home workshop 20 miles away and Mike Friesel's help, we were able to mount a little DA-150 in place of my sick 200cc engine. I didn't miss a race and ran some respectable times. This kind of racing is always such a reward because the people are such fierce competitors out on the line. However, in the pits everybody will pitch in to help get you get back into the air. A big thank you goes out to my brother Ben and club member Jeff Self who came along and worked in the pits, helped on the line, and generally made it easier on everyone to make the race an enjoyable experience for Blue Moon Racing. The next race is at El Mirage Dry Lake bed near Edwards AFB in the high deserts of California in late October.
