Jack Finney didn't get the email about the meeting being moved indoors so he was at the club field by himself.

Mark reported on the "Nothin But Cubs" fly-in & thanked Randy Byers for cooking lunch. A good time was had by all (as they say) & the event brought in \$125.00. The weather was perfect & lots of Cubs (and other floaty things) took to the air.

Mark also reported on the "Big Bird" fly-in at the club field which brought in \$150.00. It was a little windy but several giant scale aircraft flew during the event & everybody had a great time. Special thanks to Mark for donating the food & sponsoring the event!

The subject came up again of purchasing a device to monitor the 2.4 Ghz. & 5.1 Ghz. radio frequency spectrum that we use to control our aircraft & FPV devices. There wasn't enough support from members present to pursue the idea of spending any money & nothing is available for loan from the AMA. It was suggested that anyone who is having a problem buy a telemetry module that will tell you if you are loosing signal just before your aircraft crashes. Every man for himself.

Dennis Friesel reported that there will not be a float-fly on Lake Lemon this Fall because the lake level has been dropped for some railroad work.

The work on interstate 69 (SR37) has closed the West

entrance to Wylie Road. Sometimes it's open & sometimes not for now but it will eventually be closed for good. You can come into the field from the East from old 37. There will eventually be an interchange at Sample Road but it is currently possible to turn off 37/69 Northbound or Southbound at Sample Road & use the new roundabout to get over to old 37. You can also access the new roundabout from the gas station lot on top of the hill. Good luck & be careful!

Mark announced plans to get new posters of the AMA rules & the club by-laws posted at the club field. VP Rick Hill or Michael Friesel should be able to assist.
