As we all know the fun can't happen without our workers thank you all! Kit Gerhart drove in for the race and was a welcome addition to the race matrix. We got about a 30 minute headstart, racing commenced around 1030 and all the planes were fueled with Riches Brew NMPRA race mix 15% nitro with a blend of Castor and synthetic lubrication. Heck if it works for the

NMPRA it's great for us as well!

Since this was the first race of the season, we all were a little rusty on the pylons.

Hint: practice is what brings success on race day.

I don't recall a race where we had such close racing. For the most part altitude discipline was evident. We didn't have a single midair collision in the 10 races. We took a quick break after the fifth race, during the break we noticed storm clouds approaching from the south west. Smart phones predicted we were 90 minutes away from rain. Racing resumed quickly trying to beat the WX. It all worked out great all the racing was completed before the first rain drops fell. We had a tie for the top step on the podium. There are rules for resolving a tie and 1v1 fly-off is the way racers determine the winner. Clint had fast time for the event (1:45.16) and Ted from Second Poland racing was ready and eager for a head to head race one more time with Clint. It was back and forth through 7 laps until Clint cut pylon two and was relegated to the second step with Ted the winner of the race.

Eric was our grill master and cooked up some All Beef, Ball Park Franks with potato salad side dish. It turns out that during the flyoff Ted snatched fast time honors from Clint with a 1:44.57 so nearly six tenths of second faster than what Clint posted earlier. Second Poland Racing with David Poland owner and Ted as his stick man eventually prevailed as a result of the fly-off.
